Problems faced by knowledge practitioners in preserving indigenous knowledge



Prof. Patrick Ngulube's teaching areas are Archival science, knowledge and information management, records management, research methods in social science. He is also a Member of the College of Humanities Research Committee at UNISA. He was among the top 30 UKZN researchers in 2007.

Prof Ngulube received a BA cum laude Honours in History from the University of Zimbabwe, a Master of Science in Information Science from Addis Ababa University, and a PhD from the University of Natal.

He was Associate Professor at the University of Kwazulu Natal (PMB) from 2006-2007, and lecturer and senior lecturer at the University from 2000 to 2005. He was principal lecturer (part-time) and coordinator of Records Management Course from 1997 to 2000 at Harare Polytechnic College in Zimbabwe. Prior to this he spent many years as an Archivist at the National Archive of Zimbabwe, from 1986 to 2000, being Chief Archivist from 1998-2000.
